





Rosa Parks Station: The Vision



Rosa Parks Station: Typology






Located in downtown Jacksonville, this station area is defined as an 'Urban Center: Mixed-use Core'



Rosa Parks Station: TOD Framework Principles




- **A** Create high-intensity mixed-use district anchored by Rosa Parks station
- **B** Create local restaurant + bar corridor along Hogan St. for lively 18-hour activity
- **C** Create office hub for technology + health sciences companies
- **D** Redevelop vacant blocks as cluster of low-rise flex-space + live/work units for small businesses + creative industries
- **E** Create neighborhood of multifamily apartments, condos + townhomes


Reinforce north-south connectivity to The Emerald Trail and the St. Johns River by upgrading streets with Complete Streets design principles.


Traffic-calming strategies are recommended for Union & State Streets to increase safety and promote circulation for pedestrians and bicyclists.







A network of open spaces increase opportunities for outdoor recreation and respite for residents, workers and U2C riders.



Create Great Spaces: Oval Park










High-intensity, Mixed-use development is located adjacent to Rosa Parks Station and represents an expansion of downtown's Central Business District.




Specify a Mix of Uses: Mixed-use Core


Health science and technology companies could partner with FSCJ or other institutions to create a hub for research, development and innovation.


Adjacent blocks are developed with a mix of housing that diversifies the station area population and expands downtown's residential offerings.

Rey TOD Strategy: Identify Opportunities






The First Baptist Church parcels are critical to the TOD vision and should be included as part of a clear & cohesive, transit-centric plan for redevelopment.
